

# BACONE COLLEGE SAFETY DISCLOSURES

## *A COMBINED ANNUAL SECURITY REPORT AND ANNUAL FIRE SAFETY REPORT FOR 2010*

### I. INTRODUCTION

This Campus Safety Disclosure is your guide to the policies and procedures that Bacone College has implemented for the safety and security of the campus community in compliance with the Higher Education Opportunity Act and the Clery Act. Inside, you'll find a combined annual security report and annual fire safety report, as well as statistics for all available years.

On October 1<sup>st</sup> of every year, each member of the campus community is sent a copy of this annual report by electronic mail along with a brief description of its contents as follows:

"The 2010 Combined Annual Report of Annual Security Disclosures and Annual Fire Safety Report is now available! This report includes statistics for the previous four years concerning reported crimes that occurred on-campus; in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by Bacone; and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from, the campus. The report also includes institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies concerning sexual assault, and other matters. You may also make an oral or written request for a paper copy, which shall be provided without charge to you, by contacting the Bacone College Campus Police Department in person or by calling (918) 781-7200."

Logs kept pursuant to these policies are kept for public inspection at the Bacone Inn and Conference Center. A printed copy will be made available upon oral or written request.

You may contact the Bacone College Campus Police Department at **(918) 781-7200** for assistance or information at any time, day or night.

## II. ANNUAL SECURITY REPORT

### REPORTING CRIMES

Victims, witnesses or any other members of the campus community have a duty to report incidents to campus law enforcement officers immediately.

Criminal actions or other emergencies should be immediately reported to law enforcement officers in the following ways:

- Dialing 911 or;
- Calling the Bacone College Campus Police Department at (918) 781-7200 or;
- Reporting in person to the Front Desk of the Bacone Inn and Conference Center and requesting a law enforcement officer to take a report

All reports are investigated by the Muskogee County Sheriff's Office, City of Muskogee Police or the Bacone College Campus Police Department. There is no voluntary confidential reporting system available, and no report is held in confidence.

Bacone College does not have a policy governing the confidential reporting of crimes to counselors, because on-campus counseling services are not available. Off-campus counselors are strongly encouraged to disclose to law enforcement any crime reported to them by students.

### CAMPUS POLICE AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

Bacone College has its own campus police department, which has the same authority and arrest powers as a municipal police department. Each officer is duly sworn and commissioned in accordance with Oklahoma state law and peace officer training standards and may enforce both criminal laws and the rules and regulations of Bacone College. Additionally, all campus police officers hold a commission with the Muskogee County Sheriff's Office and have powers of arrest throughout all of Muskogee County and may enforce municipal ordinances throughout the city limits of the City of Muskogee.

The Bacone Substation of the Muskogee County Sheriff's Office is located on Bacone College's campus. The Sheriff's Office provides investigation and support services to the Bacone College Campus Police Department. Each deputy is duly sworn and commissioned in accordance with Oklahoma state law and peace officer training standards.

Major crimes are investigated jointly between the Bacone College Campus Police Department, the City of Muskogee Police Department, and the Muskogee County Sheriff's Office.

### TIMELY WARNINGS

In the event that a situation arises, either on or off campus, that, in the judgment of law enforcement or the college, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat and/or a Clery Act reportable crime, a campus wide "timely warning" will be issued. The warning will be issued through the college e-mail system to students, faculty, and staff; "knock and talk" notification by residence life staff; and/or the use of portable address systems mounted in emergency or patrol vehicles.

The website is immediately accessible via computer by all faculty, staff and students and printed copies of the notice may also be posted in each residence hall and/or at other conspicuous locations through the campus as the situation permits.

This process will be used for notifying the campus community of both Clery Act reportable crimes and other emergencies as described in the "Emergency Notification" section of this Annual Report.

## PREPARING THE REPORT

The annual disclosure of campus crime statistics is made possible through a partnership between the administration of Bacone College, the Police Legal Advisor at the Muskogee County Sheriff's Office, and the Lieutenant of the Bacone College Campus Police Department. Each entity provides updated information on their educational efforts and programs to comply with the Jeanne Clery Act and other federal and state law. There is no policy for a voluntary confidential reporting system for annual crime statistics; all reports are investigated by law enforcement agencies. The following is a list of titles of each person or organization reports should be made to for the purpose of making timely warnings and the annual statistical disclosure:

## SAFETY OF AND ACCESS TO CAMPUS FACILITIES

During business hours, the College (excluding certain housing facilities) will be open to students, parents, employees, contractors, guests, and other invitees. During non-business hours access, the campus is closed and access is restricted to all College facilities by identification card, access control device ("fob"), key (if issued), or by admittance through the campus police department. In the case of periods of extended closing, the College will admit only those with prior approval to all facilities.

Residence halls are access controlled at all times. Some facilities may have individual hours, which may vary at different times of the year. Examples include but are not limited to Warrior Gym and the Palmer Center Library. In these cases, the facilities will be secured according to schedules developed by the department responsible for the facility. Emergencies may necessitate changes or alterations to any posted schedules.

## SECURITY CONSIDERATIONS USED IN THE MAINTENANCE OF CAMPUS FACILITIES

Security issues such as landscaping, access control, locks, alarms, lighting, and communications are considered in the maintenance of campus facilities. During the academic year, administrative and law enforcement representatives meet regularly to discuss these considerations and their application to maintenance of campus facilities.

## **ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY OF CAMPUS PERSONNEL**

All law enforcement officers on campus are duly sworn and commissioned peace officers having full powers of arrest throughout Muskogee County, including areas off-campus. They are vested with the complete statutory authority to investigate violations of the criminal codes of the State of Oklahoma and the city ordinances of the City of Muskogee and detain and apprehend persons believed to be in violation of the law. Campus police officers have the additional authority to enforce all college rules, policies and regulations.

## **WORKING RELATIONSHIP OF CAMPUS PERSONNEL WITH STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES**

The Bacone College Campus Police Department maintains an excellent working relationship with state and local authorities, and has established a memorandum of understanding with each agency that it works closely with, including information and resource sharing.

## **ARREST AUTHORITY OF SECURITY PERSONNEL**

Bacone College does not have security personnel on its campus, therefore there is no policy related to their arrest authority. Law enforcement officers have full power of arrest in accordance with the Oklahoma Statutes for violation of Oklahoma state law and city ordinances.

## **ACCURATE AND PROMPT REPORTING POLICIES**

Bacone College has adopted policies that encourage accurate and prompt reporting of all crimes to campus police and appropriate police agencies by making such reporting a mandatory duty of all members of the campus community, and by offering rewards for information leading to arrest and prosecution and/or immunity in certain cases.

## **CONFIDENTIAL REPORTING OF CRIMES TO COUNSELORS**

Bacone College does not have mental health counselors on its campus. There are no procedures that encourage professional mental health counselors to refer persons they are counseling to report crimes on a voluntary, confidential basis for inclusion in the annual crime statistics, as each report is investigated by law enforcement officials.

## **INFORMATION AND PROGRAMS**

Informational sessions are offered to inform students and employees about:

- campus security procedures and practices
- encouraging responsibility for personal and community safety
- crime prevention
- awareness of rape, acquaintance rape and other forcible and non-forcible sex offenses

## **STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS OFF-CAMPUS**

Bacone College does not have a policy regarding monitoring and recording through local police criminal activity in which students engaged at off-campus locations of student organizations officially recognized by the institution, including organizations with off-campus housing, as there are no student organizations with off-campus locations.

## STATEMENT OF ALCOHOL POLICY

Bacone College is a dry campus, and no alcohol is permitted on the grounds or at any activity sponsored or recognized by the college. All laws related to the sale, possession, and consumption of alcoholic beverages are strictly enforced and aggressively prosecuted for the safety of our students.

## STATEMENT OF DRUG POLICY

Bacone College is a drug-free campus, and no illegal substances are permitted on the grounds or at any activity sponsored or recognized by the college. All laws related to the sale, possession, and consumption of illegal drugs or associated paraphernalia are strictly enforced and aggressively prosecuted for the safety of our students.

## DRUG OR ALCOHOL-ABUSE EDUCATION PROGRAMS

A description of drug or alcohol-abuse education programs as required under 120(a)-(d) of the Higher Education Act may be obtained through the Office of Student Life at Bacone College. Additionally, Bacone College has established an affiliation with Oklahoma's U21 organization in an effort to eliminate alcohol abuse statewide. Project Under 21 has a toll free hotline to report under 21 drinking at 1-866-STOP-U21.

## STATEMENT OF CAMPUS SEXUAL ASSAULT PROGRAM POLICY

Educational programs to promote the awareness of rape, acquaintance rape and other forcible and non-forcible sex offenses are available to interested parties and are sponsored by members of the law enforcement community. If you are a victim of a sexual assault at this institution, your first priority should be to get to a place of safety and **call 911**.

You should then obtain necessary medical treatment and report the incident in a timely manner. Time is a critical factor for evidence collection and preservation. An assault should be reported directly to a law enforcement officer, and college officials will facilitate this process. Filing a police report will not obligate the victim to prosecute, nor will it subject the victim to scrutiny or judgmental opinions from officers. Filing a police report will ensure that a victim of sexual assault receives the necessary medical treatment and tests, at no expense to the victim to the extent provided for by Oklahoma state law, and provide the opportunity for collection of evidence helpful in prosecution, which cannot be obtained later.

A victim of sexual assault should not wash, douche, use the toilet, or change clothing prior to reporting the sexual assault and undertaking an examination. Law enforcement officers will facilitate access to confidential counseling from counselors specifically trained in the area of sexual assault crisis intervention.

When a sexual assault victim contacts a law enforcement officer, investigators from the agency having jurisdiction will be notified. A representative for the college will also be notified and guide the victim through the available options and support the victim in his or her decision.

Bacone College does not offer counseling options, but law enforcement officials and college representatives are available to facilitate access to support services, which may be obtained through the Oklahoma Coalition Against Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault. Several service organizations in

Oklahoma have provided telephone numbers and made available other services for students, faculty, staff and campus community members. The Bacone College Campus Police Department will assist any interested person in contacting these agencies.

Information about college disciplinary proceedings, as well as special guidelines for cases involving sexual misconduct, may be obtained from the Office of Student Life at Bacone College.

The institution will change a victim's academic and living situations after an alleged sex offense, if those changes are requested by the victim and are reasonably available. The accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during a disciplinary proceeding; and both the accuser and the accused must be informed of the outcome of any institutional disciplinary proceeding that is brought alleging a sex offense.

Compliance with this policy does not constitute a violation of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). For the purpose of this policy, the outcome of a disciplinary proceeding means only the institution's final determination with respect to the alleged sex offense and any sanction that is imposed against the accused. A student found guilty of violating the sexual misconduct policy will be criminally prosecuted in the state courts and will be suspended or expelled from Bacone College.

**OBTAINING SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

The Oklahoma Sex and Violent Crime Offender Registry is maintained by the Oklahoma Department of Correction and is available via Internet pursuant to Oklahoma state law (Sex Offenders Registration Act, 57 O.S. 581-590) at <http://doc.state.ok.us/>

**EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION**

Bacone College will immediately notify the campus community upon the confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees on campus through the same measures outlined in the "Timely Warning" section of this Annual Report.

The institution will, without delay, and taking into account the safety of the community will determine the content of this notification and initiate the notification system, unless the notification will, in the professional judgment of the responsible authority compromise efforts to assist victims or to contain,

respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency.

The process used by Bacone College will defer to the assessment of the emergency situation based on information and intelligence provided to the college and/or the observation of hazards or conditions that pose an imminent risk or immediate threat to life, safety, or environment. Notification will be made to all persons who may be affected by the emergency and will contain information about the hazard and immediate action steps that should be undertaken and will be initiated on the orders of the responsible authorities.

The process will be managed by:

- Chief, Campus Police
- Or other such designee as assigned

Emergency information will be disseminated to the larger community through the dispatch operator at the Muskogee County Sheriff's Office, following the standard operating procedures of that agency.

Each year, Bacone College tests these procedures through a Homeland Security Exercise in conjunction with local, state, tribal and federal law enforcement agencies. The results of this exercise are published, and document both the description of the exercise and whether it was announced or unannounced.

## ACTIVE SHOOTER POLICY

An active shooter is an armed person who either immediately intends to, or has used deadly physical force against other people. The active shooter has very little concern for their own safety or threat of capture. In most cases, there is a defined list of intended victims the shooter is looking for. However, other people in the vicinity may become targets of opportunity. Typically, the active shooter will continue to seek out and use deadly force until confronted and stopped by law enforcement, suicide or other intervention. The immediate response for an active shooter is to shelter in place and secure the immediate area:

- o If safe, escape! If not, lock and/ or barricade the door as best as you can
- o Obey all direction from law enforcement – stay down and stay quiet
- o Turn off lights
- o Turn off radios, computer monitors, speakers, audible tones from cell phones, etc.
- o Keep occupants in the immediate area calm, quiet and out of sight
- o Take adequate cover behind desks, filing cabinets, etc.
- o Place signs in exterior windows to indicate the location of trapped or injured people
- o Notify Police (911) – be very specific as to what occurred and your specific location
- o Attempt to provide as much information about the shooter as possible.

Law enforcement officers from a variety of jurisdictions and wearing a number of different uniforms will respond – until then, your focus should be on maintaining a survival mentality.

## MISSING STUDENT NOTIFICATION

Official missing student reports must be referred immediately to the campus police department or

local law enforcement. If a student has been missing for more than 24 hours, report it immediately. Report missing students by telephone to the duty officer (Campus Police/Muskogee County Sheriff's Office at 918 781-7200 or in person to:

- Any officer of the Campus Police
- EVPAA/Dean of Faculty, Bacone College
- President, Bacone College
- Or other such designee as assigned

Each student living in an on-campus student housing facility has the option to register a confidential contact person to be notified in the case that the student is determined to be missing and that only authorized campus officials and law enforcement officers in furtherance of a missing person investigation may have access to this information. Even if a student does not register a contact person, local law enforcement will be notified that the student is missing. Students less than 18 years of age and not emancipated will have their parent or guardian notified.

The specific procedures that the college will follow when a student who resides in an on campus student housing facility is determined to have been missing for 24 hours is as follows:

1. Alert campus police and housing
2. Attempt to make contact by telephone
3. Check dormitory room and surrounding areas
4. Make contact with roommate
5. Make contact with friends/classmates
6. Check common areas and student center
7. Establish watch order on dormitory room
8. Patrol campus to find registered vehicle belonging to student, if present
9. Verify absence of student in classes/practices through student records
10. Verify that student has not eaten in dining hall or used off-campus dining card
11. Refer to Muskogee County Sheriff's Office and follow standard operating procedure

This policy statement does not preclude implementing these procedures in less than 24 hours if circumstances warrant a faster implementation.

# III. ANNUAL FIRE SAFETY REPORT

## FIRE SAFETY SYSTEMS

All dorms have Silent Knight or Simplex 4001 fire panels with system smoke detectors on 30 foot centers in the hallways, manual pull stations at the exits clearly marked with illuminated exit signs (with standby battery power) with Fire Extinguishers in cabinets strategically located in the hallways either in wall mounts or in marked fire cabinets. McCoy Hall, the women's dormitory, also has single station AC powered, battery standby smoke detectors in each dorm room. The New Dorms have Silent Knight fire panels, smoke detectors in the common areas and in all dorm rooms. The Bacone Inn and Conference Center, due to unique construction, has a single station smoke detector in each room. Fire Extinguishers are mounted in enclosed cabinets on the ground level and balcony (2nd floor) level.

## 2010 FIRE DRILLS

Bacone College held fire drills for each student housing facility and recorded these drills in the annual fire safety report.

## PORTABLE ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES AND SMOKING

The institution's policies and rules prohibit portable electrical appliances that are fire hazards (including but not limited to heaters and hot plates), smoking, and open flames in all student housing facilities. Violation of these rules is considered a serious threat to life safety and will result in immediate suspension from student housing.

## PROCEDURES FOR STUDENT HOUSING EVACUATION

When the fire alarm is sounded, all students are required to evacuate to a designated rally point as safely and quickly as possible. Building plans and emergency routes are posted on each floor of student housing facilities. College staff and/or law enforcement will conduct a "knock and yell" sweep to ensure that each area of the student housing facility has been evacuated. Staff at the rally points will direct the students further and ensure that all students are accounted for.

## FIRE SAFETY EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMS

Fire safety education and training programs are made available by the Bacone College CERT, and may be presented by special guests from the fire service or law enforcement.

## REPORTING THAT A FIRE HAS OCCURRED

Fires should immediately be reported to **911**. After emergency notification has been made, reports of fires should be made to the Campus Police Dispatch at 918 781-7200 or in person to:

- Any officer of the Campus Police
- EVPAA/Dean of Faculty, Bacone College
- President, Bacone College
- Or other such designee as assigned

## PLANS FOR FUTURE IMPROVEMENTS IN FIRE SAFETY

The Office of the President has established a fire safety task force to develop recommendations for improvement in both the implementation of the fire safety requirements of the HEOA and the life safety of its students and campus community. The task force will present its results to the Office of the President at the conclusion of the 2011 academic year for inclusion in the following Annual Fire Safety Report.

Bacone College has adopted the National Incident Management System (NIMS) for all of its emergency and non-emergency events. The adoption of NIMS will improve the college's response to emergencies and hazards, especially fires.
