Diversity of Enrollment

In the Academic Year of 2016-2017, enrollment of all full-time and part-time undergraduate students in credit programs was 1094. Of these 38.03% were female and 61.97% were male. 28.34% were American Indian/Alaska Native, 4.57% were Asian/Pacific Islander, 27.7% were Black, 10.51% were Hispanic, 17.18% were White, 2.93% were Two or More Races, and 8.78% were Unknown.
