Enrollment Process for Returning Students

1. Make an appointment with your Faculty Advisor to plan a schedule of classes, and register for Summer/Fall 2019, and Spring 2020 semesters.
 2. Verify your financial aid status with the Office of Financial Aid, and your student account status with Student Accounts. Both offices are located on the second floor in the Palmer Center.
 3. Verify your housing, parking, insurance, and ID Card with the Office of Housing located in the Palmer Center.
 4. Once you have completed these steps, you are officially enrolled.

1. Your first step is to contact the Office of Admissions. You will be asked to complete an Application for Admission Form and submit official copies of your high school transcripts, college transcripts for any college previously attended, ACT/SAT scores, and/or GED scores. New students should access the Enrollment Checklist online at www.bacone.edu. New students should also fill out a FAFSA online at <https://FAFSA.gov> to expedite the financial aid process.
2. After Step 1 is completed, the Office of Admissions will assist in completing the transition into the exciting academic life of Bacone College.

Withdrawals

When a student finds it necessary to withdraw from all classes, he or she must officially withdraw from the College or the academic record will reflect the grade assigned by the instructor according to the instructor's grading policy for that class. The withdrawal process begins by completing the official online withdrawal request at www.bacone.edu. During the fall and spring semesters, students have until the end of the last business day of the tenth week to withdraw from a class and not have a grade reported for the course. After the tenth week, no withdrawals are possible and the student will receive a grade for the course. Summer sessions and courses meeting at special times have withdrawal dates that may vary. Students must check the current, official Academic Calendar or the Office of the Registrar to find out the allowed dates of withdrawal for those classes. Once a student has officially registered, in order to receive a 100% refund, a withdrawal must be completed prior to the first day of class.

Refund Policy for Financial Aid Recipients Who Withdraw or Do Not Receive Passing Grades in Any Enrolled Courses (*Return of Title IV Funds*)

To officially withdraw from **all** courses students must go online to www.bacone.edu and complete the withdrawal process electronically. If students have any questions with the electronic withdrawal process they are encouraged to contact Bacone College toll free at 888.682.5514 for assistance.

Students receiving federal financial assistance who completely withdraw from all classes, or fail to receive a passing grade in all courses during a period of enrollment, will be subject to the *Return of Title IV Funds* refund policy required by federal regulation. The *Return of Title IV Funds* are calculated during each period or term of enrollment. This policy applies to students receiving assistance through the PELL Grant, Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG), Direct Subsidized Stafford Loan, Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, and Direct Parent PLUS Loan programs.

This policy assumes students “earn” their financial aid based on the period of time in which they are enrolled through the semester. This policy refers to two types of withdrawals; official and unofficial. **When a student officially withdraws from all courses**, the Office of Financial Aid will receive notification and will determine the date of withdrawal, institutional charges, and all aid disbursed. At the end of each semester, those **students who did not receive a passing grade in any of their courses may be considered an unofficial withdrawal**. These students’ withdrawal dates will be at the midpoint in the semester, the last time they attended class, or any scheduled academic event related to the period of enrollment. For those students who fail to return from an approved leave of absence, the withdrawal date will be designated as the date the leave of absence began. After determining students’ withdrawal dates, official or unofficial, the Office of Financial Aid must then determine if the amount of aid disbursed to the student is greater than the amount the student earned. Any unearned funds must be returned to the federal student aid programs. Students who remain enrolled beyond 60 percent of the semester are considered to have earned 100 percent of aid received. Students who are enrolled for less than 60 percent of the semester will likely be responsible for repaying a portion of the financial aid received. When performing a *Return to Title IV* calculation, all students’

institutional charges, i.e., tuition, fees, and room and board, are included in the calculation, as well as all disbursed federal aid. Any refund amount calculated from this formula that the College must return will be returned to the appropriate federal aid programs as determined by the *Return of Title IV Funds* process. Any loan funds returned as a result of the *Return of Title IV Funds* process will go into repayment based on the regular repayment terms of their promissory note. Students must be aware that when the College is required to return unearned funds due to their withdrawal, they may have a balance due to the school. Bacone College must complete the *Return to Title IV process within 45 days of the date of a student's withdrawal. Students will be notified by mail within approximately two (2) weeks of this completed process.*

Refund Policy For Students Who Are No Shows

Students who enroll and do not attend a single class the following “No Show” Refund Policy will be applied as follows:

1. Administratively withdraw the student.
2. Assess a “No Show” fee of \$1,000 for Off-Campus students and \$2,000 for On-Campus Students.
3. Full refunds would be made for tuition or tuition, room, and board; all other fees are not subject to refund.

Refund Policy For Students Due to Medical Emergencies

The “Medical Emergency” Refund Policy will be as follows:

- Administratively withdraw the student.
- 50% refund of tuition and a prorated refund of room & board for students who cannot finish a semester due to a documented medical emergency.

TUITION REFUNDS

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT

College policies regarding family educational and privacy rights are governed by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA). Copies of the act, policies, and regulations are maintained in the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs and the Registrar's Office.

PUBLIC DIRECTORY INFORMATION

This is information which routinely appears in student directories and alumni publications and may be released by the institution for any purpose, at its discretion. Upon written request by the student, this information will be treated as confidential and released only with the student's written consent. Forms for withholding student "Directory Information" are available in the Registrar's Office and in the Admissions Office.

Bacone College hereby designates the following student information as public or "Directory Information."

- a. Student's name, local and permanent address, and telephone number
- b. Date and Place of birth
- c. Classification and enrollment status
- d. Major field of study
- e. Gender
- f. Dates of attendance at Bacone College
- g. Most recent previous school attended
- h. Degrees, honors, and awards received
- i. Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- j. Weight and height of athletic team members
- k. Photograph
- l. E-mail address assigned/provided by the institution or provided to the college by the student.

Bacone College assumes that failure on the part of the student to specifically request the withholding of "Directory Information" indicates individual approval for disclosure. Students are informed of their rights under FERPA through the official college catalog and through periodic notices in the campus newspaper and other publications.

DISCLOSURE OF EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

Bacone College will disclose information from a student's education records only with the written consent of the student, with the following exceptions as defined in FERPA, as amended, which waive prior student consent:

1. School officials who have a legitimate educational interest in the records.
2. Officials of schools to which the student seeks to transfer.
3. The Comptroller General of the United States, the HEW Secretary, the administrative head of an educational agency, or State educational authorities.
4. In connection with a student's application for, or in receipt of, financial aid.
5. To State or local officials or authorities if specifically required by a State law that was adopted before November 17, 1974.
6. To organizations or educational agencies conducting legitimate research, provided no personally identifiable information about the student is made public.
7. Accrediting organizations.
8. Parents of a dependent study upon proof of dependency as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.
9. To comply with a judicial order or lawfully issued subpoena: provided that the educational agency or institution makes a reasonable effort to notify the student of the order or subpoena in advance of compliance.

10. To appropriate parties in a health or safety emergency.
11. The results of any disciplinary proceeding conducted by the College against an alleged perpetrator of a crime of violence to the victim of that crime.

This information shall only be transferred to a third party; however, on the condition that such party will not permit any other party to have access to the information without the written consent of the student.

ACCESS TO EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

In accordance with FERPA, as amended, eligible students are eligible to access official educational records directly related to the student, including the right of inspection and review. Students should contact the appropriate records custodian for more information. A list of the types, location, and custodians of educational records is listed below.

CORRECTION OF EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

Students have the right to ask to have records corrected that they believe are inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of their privacy acts. Contact the records custodian for more information.

STUDENTS RIGHT-TO-KNOW AND CAMPUS SECURITY ACT

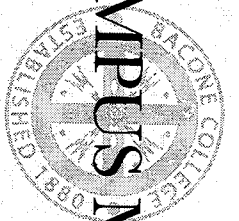
In compliance with Title I, The Students Right to Know Act, information regarding graduation rates is available in the Registrar's Office.

STATEMENT ON LEARNING AND PHYSICAL DISABILITIES

Bacone College accepts students with learning and physical disabilities and provides reasonable accommodation to help them be successful. Depending on the nature of the disability, some students may need to take a lighter course load and may need more than four years to graduate. Disability accommodations in higher education are approached differently than in grades K-12, and colleges and universities are not obligated to provide the same accommodations provided by a previous school. For details from Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the American with Disabilities Act of 1990 regarding Documentation Guidelines, Burden of Proof, Individualized Accommodations, and Guidelines,

See Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act referenced on the Bacone Website. Students needing accommodation should apply as early as possible, usually the semester before they plan to attend classes. Immediately upon admittance to Bacone College, students need to identify and document the nature of their disabilities. This documentation usually consists of a recent high school Individualized Education Program (IEP) or results from testing done by a psychologist, psychiatrist, medical doctor and/or another qualified, licensed individual. It is the responsibility of the student to provide the College with appropriate materials documenting the learning and/or physical disability. The College does not provide assessment services for students who may be learning disabled nor does the College have structured programs available for students with emotional or behavioral disabilities. 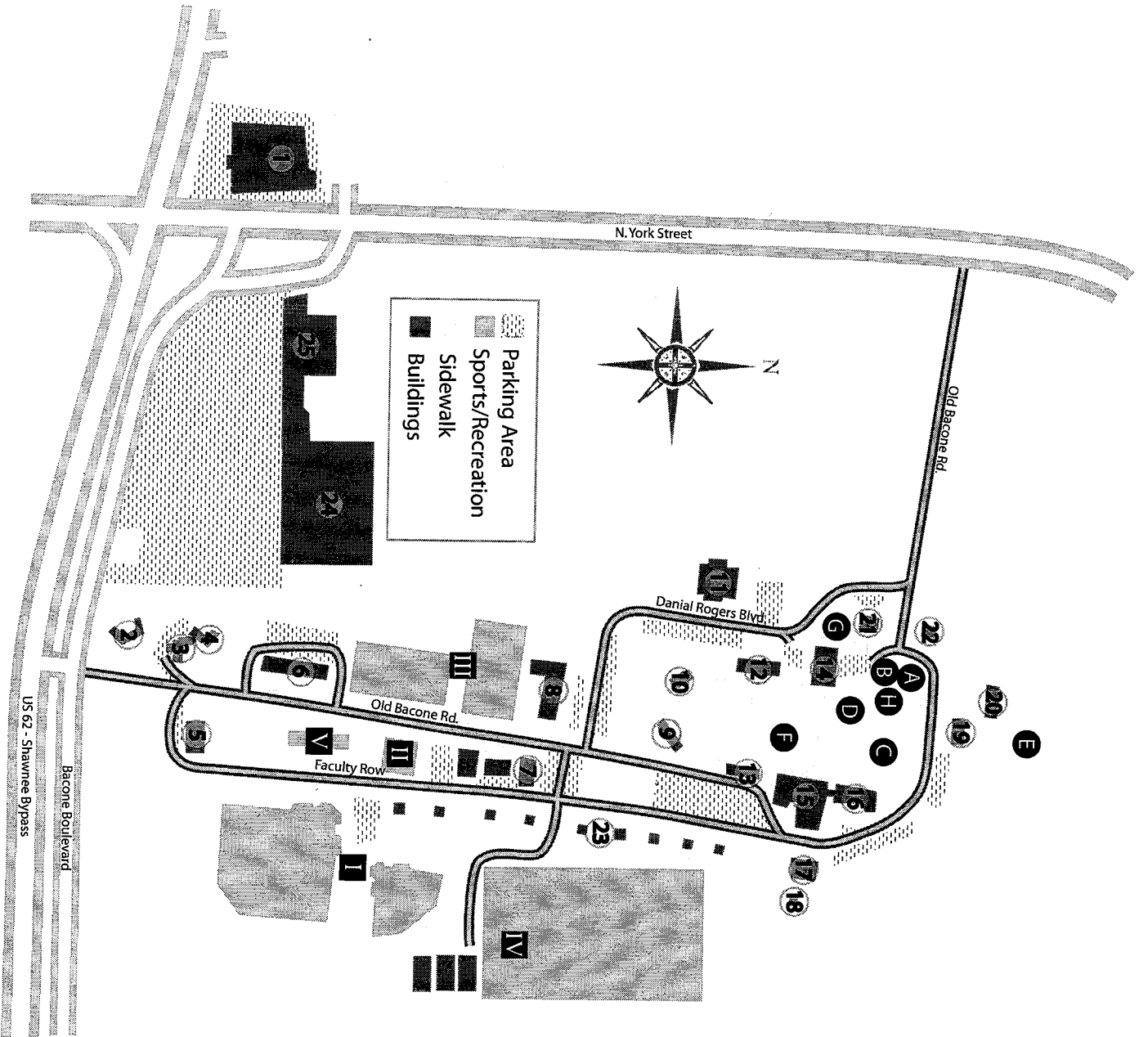

Building

1. Conference Center – Houses the Dining Hall and a Student Center, as well as offices for Operations, Campus Police, Housing, and Food Service.
2. Walter Starr Hall – Built in 1923; houses Welcome Center, Adult Education Programs, Admissions, Financial Aid, and Registrar.
3. Lucy Peters Hall – Built in 1922. Building has a meeting room, classroom, and office areas.
4. Pololke-Bosen Hall – Built in 1923. Home to Native American programs.
5. Kiva Lodge: Home of Alumni Offices and Native American Student Organizations.
6. Alexander Posey Hall – Men's residence hall.
7. A, B, & C Dorms - Residential halls built in 2001.
8. Old Warrior Gym – Moved to campus in 1947. Formerly a NCO Club at Camp Gruber. Gym Annex – Built in 1968. Houses weightroom and Athletic Department offices.
9. Benjamin Wacocche Hall – Built in 1924. Serves as a meeting hall and houses Student Life offices.
10. McCombs Hall – Built in 1938. Houses the Art Department. Famous art students such as Acee Blue Eagle, Dick West, Woody Cumbo, Terry Saul, Ruth Blalock Jones, and others were taught here.
11. C.C. Harmon Nursing Facility – Opened in 1967. Houses the Health Science programs.
12. Isaac McCoy Hall – Built in 1937. Serves as a female residence hall.
13. Barnett Hall – Built in 1923. Once a dormitory, now houses faculty for Arts & Sciences, Business, General Studies, and School of Education departments.
14. Bacone Memorial Chapel – Originally built in 1941. Rebuilt in 1992 after being destroyed by fire. Serves as the center of all religious life activities on campus.
15. The Palmer Center – Built in 1997. Houses the gymnasium, student lounge, snack bar, bookstore, theater, and Student Support Services.
16. Samuel Richard Hall – Built in 1921. Serves as the main classroom building and library, and offices of the President, Vice President & Dean of Faculty, and Development Office.
17. Maintenance Department – The upkeep and repair hub of campus buildings and grounds.
18. Foundry – Houses the bronze casting classes associated with the art department.
19. Sally Journeycake Hall – Built in 1937. Formerly a dormitory. Today houses the office of Human Resources, Printshop, and the Business Office.
20. Patrick Hurley House – Home of the College President.
21. Ataloa Lodge Museum – Opened in 1932 to serve as an art building. Today houses one of the largest privately owned collections of American Indian artifacts in the country.
22. Log House – Built in 1939 to teach the home economics classes. Today it is a faculty/ staff home.
23. Faculty Row – Faculty and Staff residences.

Memorials

- A. Salt Kettle – Was one of more than 100 formed as equipment of the Mackey Salt

Works on the military road to Ft. Smith, Arkansas.

- B. Millie Francis Monument – In honor of a Creek Indian woman who after saving the life of a soldier in 1817 was awarded a Medal by Congress. She died in 1844 before receiving it.
- C. Alice Robertson Rock – Named for the second U.S. Congress member and Daughter of American Revolution activist from Muskogee. The rock was removed from her home, Sawoka, located on Agency Hill, here in Muskogee.
- D. Stone Bible – Etched with the names and dates of service of each of Bacones' presidents.
- E. Bacone College Cemetery – Burial place of Almon C. Bacone, teachers, students, and other dignitaries.
- F. Company "I" Memorial – Created to honor Bacone Alumni who fought in five of our nation's wars. The memorial was funded by WWII vets of Company I of the 45th Infantry.
- G. Original Bacone Baptistery – Completed in 1885. Still in use today.
- H. Chickasaw Warrior – Artwork of alumni, Enoch Kelly Haney, donated May of 2011.

- I. Warrior Baseball Park – Home of the Bacone Warrior Men's Baseball team and the Lady Warrior's Softball team.
- II. Basketball Courts – Available for Bacone Students' use.
- III. Practice Fields – Football and Soccer
- IV. Rodeo Grounds – Built in 2008. Consists of arena and three stables.
- V. Volleyball Courts - Available for Bacone Students' use.
